
1.1 WOMENS DAY AVAL PROGRAMME

The student participation met our expectations, with a total of 45 teams successfully registering. Each team was comprised of 6 members, including a mandatory female participant, ensuring a diverse and inclusive approach. Of the registered teams, a remarkable 29 submitted their innovative ideas for consideration. After careful review, 11 teams emerged as finalists, earning the opportunity to present their concepts in the final round.

The evaluation criteria for the hackathon encompassed the following key aspects:

- Problem solution fit
- Technical feasibility
- Novelty
- Implementation viability
- Overall presentation

To ensure a thorough evaluation, each team's presentation was reviewed against these criteria by a panel of assessors, comprising both representatives from the Crescent Innovation Incubation Council (CIIC) and experts from our institute. After this comprehensive assessment, the top-performing teams were identified by combining score sheets from both evaluating bodies. This approach guaranteed that the most promising and deserving ideas were duly recognized and selected for further progression.

Day 1

On the first day, the event's registration commenced at 9 am. Refreshments and lunch tokens were provided, mirroring the previous day's arrangements. The evaluation process extended until 5:00 pm, similar to the preceding day.

Day 3

Attendance was noted on the third day, and students were tasked with completing their projects by 2:30 pm. Final evaluations commenced at the same time, followed by the valedictory session at 3:30 pm. Mr. Parvez Alam and Dr. Karthikeyan Ramalingam initiated the prize distribution ceremony with brief talks. Mr. Dinesh Kumar, Director of Startup TN, graced the occasion as the chief guest, delivering a motivational speech to the students. He presented prizes to the winners. Mrs. Aisha Banu, HoD CSE, shared an inspirational message, and Mr. Irfan, an alumnus of Crescent, delivered a pep talk. Noteworthy achievements included team ELWIZ winning the first prize of 30,000/- for their project on "Prevention of Road Accidents." For the problem statement "IoT-based Smart Waste Management," team MEGATRONS secured the winner's prize of 30,000/-, while runner-up team FUTURE DREAMERS received 15,000/-. 




2.3 GAME NIGHT


2.7 PAKIRNTHU UNN


Valedictory Ceremony & Host Performance:
