GRAFFITI ART is a term that refers to images or text painted usually onto buildings ,typically using spray paint.



#### **MINERVA**


Minerva, named after the Roman Goddess of Wisdom, was a month long virtual literary festival conducted by the Crescent Literary Society during the month of June.

In the 1st Week of Minerva, the event schedule was released to the audience along with the rulebook for the events.

The Quizzer's Circuit, a subordinate club of Crescent Literary Society, took charge of the first week of Minerva and conducted Intrigue, a general knowledge quiz hosted on the 5th of June 2020 through the club's official Instagram page, @crescentlitsociety. The event was graced with over 100

attendees, both from Crescent and colleges in and around Chennai. It was an entertaining as well as informative event. Each participant was handed a set of 5 challenging questions, with 15 seconds allotted to them for answering each. The event lasted f or exactly 3 hours and it would be an understatement to call it a rollercoaster ride from the beginning till the very end. The final cash prize of Rs.1,000/- was bagged by Yuvanshankar (1st year B. Tech) of Crescent Institute.

The Quizzer's Circuit of Crescent Literary Society also informed their audience the emphasis of possessing the right knowledge, the dangers of misinformation and the broadcasting of fake news by numerous media outlets in modern society. Various tools and resources were provided to the audience which could be used to prevent the propagation of fake news.



Twisted tales, the creative writing event of Minerva started accepting entries from the 1 st of June. There were nearly 30 participants for the first round, and the task assigned was to draw one's own conclusion to a classic fairy tale. The final date for submissions was June 15th. The judges of the first round Fathima Zahra Khan (4th year, B.Arch.), Lazim Rasheed (Editor in Chief, 4 th year, B. Tech Mechanical) and Samyuktha Prasanan (Secretary of Writer's Guild, 4th year, B. Tech CSE) shortlisted 8 entries for the next round which was also The Finals. This round required the finalists to write a short story within 180 Characters, excluding spaces. The entries for this round were to be turned in by the 25th. The judges for the finals were Atul.G, Faheem, and Farheen (Alumni - Crescent Literary Society- 2017). The top 2 entries which gathered the most points, were declared as

Overall, the event was a huge success and provided wonderful stories that kept up the spirit of competition until the end.


Crescent Literary Society announced the third week of June, 2020 (16.06.2020 to 22.06.2020) as the week for the House of Debaters. The Parley, a virtual debate competition was scheduled on June 19 and June 20, 2020 under the guidance of the Secretary of House of Debaters, Sujan Ganesh (4th year, B.BA, LLB Hons.). The registration for the said event was opened along with the release of Minerva's rulebook on 01.06.2020. The Parley had 45 registered participants who showered us with well-structured informative arguments for the topics provided.

With the announcement of the start of Debate Week made on 16.06.2020, wise words explaining the importance of debating from Ms. Ayesha, the Founding person of Crescent Debating Society, was featured on the Crescent Literary Society's Instagram handle, @crescentlitsociety. Later that evening, information regarding the Preliminary Round 1 was conveyed to the participants in which they were asked to send an argumentative essay of 300 words on a particular topic.

On 17.06.2020, the results of Preliminary Round 1 were announced and the top 16 scorers of this round would qualify for the Preliminary Round 2. On 19.06.2020, the Preliminary Round 2 commenced at 12.00 PM and the participants joined through a Zoom video conference. The Judges for this round were Anirudh S (3rd year, ECE), Operations Head and Mehran (3rd year, ECE), Campaign Manager, Crescent Literary Society. The top 8 scorers of this round were sent forward to the Semi Final Round occurring on June 20, 2020.

The Semi Finals round commenced at 12.00 PM on Google Meet. The Judges for this round were Mr. Umar, (former President of Crescent Literary Society 2018), and Ms. Farheen (Former Head of Debating Society, Crescent Literary Society 2019). The participants displayed their grit by putting forth fierce arguments.

On the evening of the same day, the Finals commenced at 06.00 PM on Google Meet in the



presence of Dr. Karthikeyan Ramalingam (Dean, Student Affairs), Dr. Rathna P (Professor, Staff Coordinator, Crescent Literary Society) and a few other members of Crescent Literary Society. The Judges for this Round were Ms. Noureen Taj, (Former Editor in Chief, Crescent Literary Society 2018) and Mr. Nizamu Hameed (Alumni of Crescent Literary Society 2018). The Judges were unable to choose a winner from the top 4 contestants and thus an Ultimate Finale was

conducted in order to decide the winner from the top 2 scorers of the previous round. Saniya Mirza, (2nd year, B.Tech ECE) from Crescent Institute was declared as the winner of The Parley bringing laurels to our Institute and won Rs. 1000 as the cash prize. Ms. Rajni Soundararajan, from SRM University was crowned the Runner up of The Parley collecting Rs. 500 as the cash prize.

With 22.06.202 being the last day of the Debate Week, a talk show was streamed live on the Club's Instagram handle at 06.00 PM, hosted by Mr. Zaid, (4th year, B. Tech Mechanical), Convener of Quizzers Circuit and Mr. Arbaz (3rd year, BCA Data Science) on the topic "India vs China: the past, present and future". The talk show turned out to be highly informative and beneficial for the audience.



Week 3 of Minerva started out with our members debriefing about Improv Theatre, providing some tips and tricks to have in mind while performing improvisation.

This was soon followed by the release of the first Instagram filter developed by Crescent Literary Society, The Spin-a-Yarn filter. The filter

had three prompts which would change each time a user sees it, and can be made into a 15 second Instagram story. The release of this filter gained extreme popularity among the students.

Towards the end of improv week, the Improv theatre team released a 6-minute quarantine skit. The skit was co-written by Preesha (Convener of Improv theatre, 4th year, B. Tech Biotechnology) and Abbas (4th year, B. Tech Polymer). The skit was directed by Preesha and edited by Azfar (2nd year, BTech CSE). The cast members included Azfar, Talha (2nd year, B.Tech CSE), Vikram (2 nd year, B.Tech EEE), Adnan (3rd year B.Tech ECE), Hussain (3rd year, B.Tech CSE) and Varshini (3rd year, B.Tech CSE).



# WORLD BLOOD DONOR DAY



World Blood Donor Day was celebrated by the Crescent Literary Society in collaboration with the Crescent Blood Donors on the 14th of June,2020. The event comprised of an informative quiz and a live session; spreading awareness on blood donation, unknown facts, and common myth-busters.

The quiz, prepared by Zaid Abdullah (3rd year B.Tech Mech, Convener of Quizzers Circuit- Crescent Literary Society) was taken up by around 200 people and immensely helped to check one's cognizance about Blood donation. The questions aided in better understanding and the need to donate blood. Several facts, which the public is unfamiliar with were asked in order to let people know about their knowledge regarding this noble

practice. Certificates were sent through an automated system to the participants who passed the quiz.

The live session was conducted on Crescent Literary Society's official Instagram page (@crescentlitsociety) around 6 pm on June 14th to educate more than 300 people about blood donation. The session was hosted by Talha Abdur Rahman (1st year B.Tech ECE - Crescent Literary Society) and joining him was Kalesh Khan (4th year B. Tech Civil- Crescent Blood Donors). Together, they discussed the common myths regarding blood donation and answered some basic queries that people tend to have about donating blood. The Q&A session was incredibly informative as Kalesh Khan answered all the questions posed by Talha Abdur Rahman, especially on the health aspects such as the side effects and benefits of blood donation. The kind of nutrition or diet to be taken by a donor, before and after a blood donation was also made clear in this session. Several myths that were believed by the public for ages were also discussed, such as the assumption of getting one's immune system weak by donating blood or even getting a disease due to a donation.

All the barriers of people's minds that prevented them from donating blood were addressed and broken free though the campaign. It turned out to be extremely fruitful, encouraging and helped create a positive wave among the student masses.

# **NETFLIX TRIVIA**



the club's presence/reach on social media by bringing together people with a passion for entertainment provided by Netflix. Participants hailed from various colleges in and around Chennai, Madras Institute of Technology, Madras Christian College and Lovola College, Women's Christian College, VIT University, Easwari Engineering College and Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering to name a few. The participants were given registered multiple choice questions in the 1st round of



questions. The questions were a mix of some of the most popular and trending Netf lix shows, and also from series which have developed a cult following over the years.

50 individuals participated in the 1st round of the event and the top 10 scorers took part in the 2 nd round which had 10 questions. The 2nd round was held from 7:15 pm to 8:15 pm. The 1 st highest scorer and the 2nd highest scorer were named the "Winner" and "Runner-up". The Kahoot! app/website automatically calculates the scores in real time, erasing the possibility of any error in scores. The winner receives a cash prize of Rs. 1000 while the Runner-up receives a cash prize of Rs. 500 along with e certificates. The winner and runner-up were announced on the Crescent Literary Society Instagram page. The winner was Kavin V. from Madras Institute of Technology with a score of 4582 and the runner-up was Sreeram M. from Easwari Engineering College with a score of 4419.


There were 5 different authors who were interviewed by our hosts, which acted as a promotional platform for the authors and a learning experience for our members. Each of these

authors shared their toils, efforts and struggles behind publishing a book, which was an eye-opening experience for all of our members. The Live Interview was not just between the host and the Author,


but it allowed the viewers of the Live to ask questions about the book and its making, which were answered by the Authors.

Many of the students enthusiastically volunteered and participated in these events. To finish off with we informed the students of the audition that will be conducted on 24th October and an audition application form was sent along with links to our social media channels such as YouTube and Instagram so that they can explore and learn more about us.

# **MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS**

The Writers Guild have always wanted to mould and shape the writer within every member and to aid that vision, the Guild conducted mentorship sessions, exclusively for the club members. The sessions were headed by Ms. Kaaviya Balakrishnan, President, CLS and an astounding writer, who has won several prizes at various events. The sessions imparted knowledge relating to the various forms of poetry and their rules, syllabification, writing stories or novels etc., to name a few. To top it all off, the special session on slam poetry, conducted by Ms. Farheen, an alumnus of CLS and keen writer, explained the rules of slam poetry and it was followed by a practice session. All these helped the writers finesse their writing skill to a great extent.

The House of Debaters, strive at kindling and inspiring the debater that is secretly hidden in every member and raisee the standards of debate and argumentation in every deliberation. In pursuit of these goals, the House held Debate Mentorship Sessions headed by Mr. Sujan G, Secretary, House of Debaters, who is an avid debater and a lawyer by profession, exclusively for the members of Crescent Literary Society. The pparticipants were briefed and explained about the various rules of debating that are followed in each style of debate. A debate does not only involve putting forth arguments and arguing, but it also involves questioning the opposition based on their arguments. For that, the members are trained for rebuttals and questioning sessions as well. Mere teaching or lecturing on the techniques, they are also given various relevant topics and asked to deliver a well-structured argument, as if they were competing. After the delivery, their performance is assessed and suggestions or corrections are given to the participants by the Senior Members of CLS.

The Improv & Theatre house, was no exception to this phenomenal program. Quick thinking and assertive response, is something that every orator needs to possess. This is mastered with strenuous practice and understanding of the basic rules of improv. Ms. Preesha Christina Anan d, the Convenor, Improv Theatre, took up the task of heading the mentorship session, as she is an experienced orator. Various rules of improv were discussed, multiple practice sessions were conducted, all aiming at making the speakers, an established orator, inside and outside the club.

Apart from the above, mentorship sessions for designing and video editing were also conducted to new skills among the members.

The sessions are conducted in a periodical manner and to help the members in this regard, materials and documents were also shared among them.

# **AUDITIONS '20**

As per the annual tradition, Crescent Literary Society conducted auditions for the academic year 2020-21. 
#### **Writers Guild**

Improv theatre or improvisation theatre is a form of theatricals that involves unscripted or unplanned performances created spontaneously by the performer. Improv requires multiple skill sets as one must be able to think on their feet and entertain the audience. The participants were judged by a panel of 7




#### **House of Debaters**

CLS always had outstanding debaters right from its inception. It was judged by a panel of 5 judges, headed by the Secret ary of House of Debaters, Sujan G(4th year Law). The participants were given an on-spot topic and were asked to speak on their stance for 60 seconds followed by a question from the judges which was expected to be answered for 30 seconds. 15 students participated on the 24th of Oct and 17 on the 30th of Jan.

#### Conclusion

In conclusion the auditions for the academic year 2020-21 was conducted online through Google Meet on 24 Oct, 2020 and 30<sup>th</sup> Jan, 2021 and was split into four events, one for each of the sub clubs. Overall, the audition was a huge success and out of 150+ participants across the 4 subevents, 30 were selected to be members of the Crescent Literary Society and in coordination with the existing members will help the club grow above and beyond in the future.

# **WOMAN UP!**



Woman up was an intra-college congressional discussion conducted by the Crescent Literary Society on the occasion of International Woman's Day. The participants of event were each given a societal issue faced by women for which they were asked to suggest practical and logical solutions. The event was open to all genders and consisted of three rounds.

The first round of the event entailed the participants to send a write up on the prompt, "In 300 words (or less) describe what you think is the most pressing issue faced by women in 2021 and propose a solution to tackle the said issue.". The students of BSA Crescent Institute of Science and Technology were informed of the event by posters

throughout the institution and various social media channels like the Crescent Literary Society's Instagram page. An accompanying Google form link was included to allow the participants to submit their entry. The registrations were open from 12.00 PM of March 4th, 2021 (Thursday) to

PM of March 5th, 2021 (Friday). We received 51 submissions through the Google form within the completion of the first round. The President and Secretary of Crescent Literary Society evaluated the first round's submissions and 25 participants were shortlisted.

The shortlisted participants advanced to the second round. They were sent an email that contained an assigned personality, who was one among a list of celebrated women from various fields. They were to assume the given character and provide solutions for the issue provided. The issue was given 1 hour prior to allow the participants to prepare. Some of the issues included sexual exploitation in the entertainment industry, gender wage gap in the sports industry and the Pink Tax on woman centric products. The event was held on the Google Meet platform and was live streamed on the Crescent Literary Society's YouTube channel, from 6:00 PM.

The second and third rounds were presided over by Dr P. Rathna and Dr Syed Mohammed Adil Zaidi, Professors, Department of English, BSACIST, who announced their decisions at the end of the round. The top 5 contestants were advanced to the next round based on their eloquence, knowledge and understanding of current events.



In the third round was a group discussion among the 5 participants on the prompt, "Pharmacies are not willing to provide emergency contraceptives, even after the ban on them has been lifted. How can we curtail this issue? What solutions do you propose to tackle the increasing number of sexual assault and rape cases around the world?" The

participants provided creative solutions such as a more open and structured methodology for sex education in schools, counselling and therapy to rapists during their time in prison, awareness of contraceptive pills to both rural and urban populations, informing women of the rights they have in the country and several others.

After a round of Q&A between the judges and the participants, the judges had an internal discussion and announced the results for the event. The final results of the event are as follows,

After which hosts Rubina and Abdul Rauf from the Crescent RJ/VJ Club took us through the evening – beginning with a little background on Indian culture and art forms. First of the performances, was a graceful classical and fusion dance by Karishma and Nivetha from Crescent Dance Team. The hosts returned with a light-hearted chatter about the guests' Tamizh language proficiency. Followed by

The event took off at 10 am following the inauguration with the writing event organized by Writers Guild, in which the participants were given prompts to write both prose and poetry within a duration of two hours. The works of participant were judged by Samyuktha Prasanan (4 <sup>th</sup> year CSE, Secretary, Writers Guild) and Lazim Rasheed (4<sup>th</sup> year, Mech, Editor in Chief).



Simultaneously, events of Improv Theatre commenced and were judged by Kaaviya Balakrishnan (4<sup>th</sup> year, Biotech, President, Crescent Literary Society). The participants were given the option to choose one of the three events – Elevator Pitching, Stress Interview or Shipwreck - to perform and were judged on the basis of their creativity, humor, body language and coherence.

"Block and Tackle" by the House of Debaters was held subsequently at 11 AM, comprised of two rounds, both judged by Sujan Ganesh (4th year Law, Secretary, House of Debaters). In Round One, each participant was given a prompt on which they had to speak for one minute in accordance with the given commands. The participants were graded on the basis of argumentation, flow and clarity.

away as well. The prizes were distributed on stage by Dr Karthikeyan Ramalingam, Dean, Student Affairs and other staff coordinators.






#### **OPEN MIC, IMPROV & QUIZ NIGHT**

# **YouTube**


